Buckland Neighbourhood Plan Referendum

Information Statement

Referendum: Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2022

A neighbourhood planning referendum will be held for the Buckland Neighbourhood Plan on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2022.

The question which will be asked in the Referendum is:

'Do you want Buckinghamshire Council to use the neighbourhood plan for Buckland to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?'

The referendum area and the neighbourhood plan areas cover the same area as the parish of Buckland (see map below).

## Can I vote?

- You can vote in the referendum if you live in the parish of Buckland, and
- You are registered to vote in local council elections, and
- You are 18 years of age or over on Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> November 2022.
- You have to be registered to vote by 18 October 2022 to vote in the referendum. You

The expense limit that will apply in relation to the referendum is £2,362 + (638 x £0.059) = £2,399.64

The number of persons entitled to vote in the referendum by reference to which that limit has been calculated is 638.

The referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures similar to those used at local government elections.


