- c) registered consultees on the Council's Planning Policy Consultation Database who provided an e-mail address were notified by e-mail on 25th September 2015;
- d) other registered consultees on the Council's Planning Policy Consultation Database were notified by letter sent out on 25th September 2015;
- e) a joint press release with Seer Green Parish Council was issued on 23rd September 2015 and was also reported on the 'getbucks' website (www.getbucks.co.uk) on 23rd September 2015.

In addition Seer Green Parish Council:

- a) provided details of the Application on the 'News' page of The Seer Green Parish website (<u>www.seergreenparishcouncil.gov.uk</u>); and
- b) displayed a public notice on all the Parish Notice Boards from 25th September 2015.
